Served the Beaver Dam branch of Rocky  Creek Reformed Presbyterian Church  Served on Committee to oversee the  Reformed Presbyterian Church in  America  Suspended from ministry 24 June 1795  Deposed from ministry by Reformed  Presbytery 5 February 1801  School Teacher  Died 6 September 1816 in Chester Co., SC  Buried in Paul's Graveyard in Chester  County, SC</p>	<p>=</p>	<p>Elizabeth Clark  Born Co.
