

### ANNUAL MARTIN LUTHER KING BREAKFAST ON MONDAY, JANUARY 15

The 49<sup>th</sup> Annual MLK Breakfast will be held Monday, January 15, 8:30 a.m. at the Wyndam Hotel. Westminster will be a Gold Sponsor, donating \$1,500. It is symbolic and meaningful for us to have a presence at this community celebration, especially in light of our rich history as advocates for racial justice and equality.

She also serves on the boards of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Illinois, Springfield YMCA and the Community Foundation for the Land of Lincoln.

HELPING HANDS FACILITY RIBBON CUTTING will be Wednesday, January 17th, at 10:00 a.m. at their new facility 2200 Shale Street, Springfield, IL 62703. Following planned remarks, the media will have an opportunity to tour the new facility. In November 2022, Sangamon County and Helping Hands of Springfield jointly announced their partnership to establish a new homeless shelter in Springfield. The new facility aligns with the strategic plan developed by the Heartland Continuum of Care to address homelessness. It provides emergency and transitional shelter services, as well as a range of day services, within a single location. To finance the project, Sangamon County utilized \$9 Million in funds from the federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).
