MISSION SUNDAY - On Sunday, February 4, mission will be highlighted during worship. This is the eighth Mission Sunday which began in 2016. Rev. Christian Choi, Associate Pastor for Parish Life, will preach. A booklet including a comprehensive list of the 2023 mission supported by Westminster and the members of the committees who serve will be distributed. The total Mission Giving for 2023 is \$276,263. This giving is divided among the Operating Fund, Special Offerings, Presbyterian Women, and the Support and Endowment Mission Funds and does not include the addition Organizations,

Grants, and In-kind gifts of \$107,395 enlisted by Westminster as the sponsoring congregation for the Steadfast Neighbor Habitat Build.
