Along with award-winning architecture and sculpture, one can discover and explore labyrinths and a park dedicated to 20th century theologian, Paul Tillich.

Members and friends are invited to join Dr. Kieffer and Dale Rogers on a journey to New Harmony for a Spring Retreat Thursday–Saturday, May 2-4. Participants are welcome to drive down Thursday morning to visit the historic city, shop, and enjoy lunch.
