2024 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN REFLECTION



Scott and I were happy to be asked to serve on the Stewardship (Campaign) because we strongly believe giving is an essential part of our faith life and that of our church family. Beginning 67 years ago, we watched our parents express their faith by giving and learned the joy of doing it firsthand alongside them. My Mother wrote a poem to her 8 children, every Christmas and on each of her birthdays. Her message was always the same - insisting we spend no money on her but share it with "the least of these." THAT was her favorite gift. And yes, over decades, her family has purchased enough Heifer livestock to fill a small country and then some!

For the past 38 years, Scott and I have continued that walk and have shown our children what it looks like to care for others with time and money, as Jesus asks us all to do. Sometimes we give our time singing praises from the choir loft, grooming the Memorial Garden, or building things with high schoolers in Appalachia. Each year, we prayerfully stretched towards giving ten percent of the money God has graciously allowed us to have. Reaching the "tithe" level of giving has been exciting - seeing that we can truly live just fine on 90% of what we earn, and watching God multiply blessings of all kinds as we set God's portion aside first.

Thank you all for being such a wonderful church family of brothers and sisters with whom we can share this journey of life and faith, showing us all the ways God uses everyone's hands and feet to care for this world. Please prayerfully consider how you will share a portion of your dollars so that Westminster can increase the ways we serve "the least of these" together.
