### 2023 STEWARDSHIP CAMPGIAN REFLECTION

You will not read in this reflection any profound quotes or inspirations. However, you will find a story of how a little girl felt safe and the impact of a church family who gave their time, talent, and treasure.

When this girl was young, she grew up in a household plagued with physical and verbal abuse. The house did not brim with laughter. Rather, the walls held screaming matches while she hid behind a pile of toys counting the seconds until it ended. Silent periods in the house were not peaceful, but uneasy; a ticking time bomb until something else erupted. This happened in an unending cycle day-after-day, but Wednesdays were different.

On Wednesdays after school, she and a couple neighborhood kids attended a local church to eat dinner and play games. On these nights, church volunteers enveloped the little girl with love as they listened to her, played with her, and made her feel welcome. She felt comfortable to speak up, answer questions in Bible Trivia, laugh without worry, and simply be a kid. After games, women from the congregation often made a hot meal for the children to enjoy. The girl loved Wednesday nights so much that her stomach turned when the 90 minutes ended because she yearned for the peace she felt at church.

To the volunteers, cooks, youth teachers, and pastor, it was just another night. Wednesdays were another routine day filled partially with volunteer work. To that little girl, that night was often the only night where, for those 90 minutes, she was safe to be a kid.

That girl never forgot the impact of the church family. That girl is me.

The time, talent, and treasure that you can give often reaches far beyond your comprehension. For you, it could be time, financial means, cooking, teaching, or cleaning. But to others, it means love, safety, home, and peace. I implore you to move forward and exercise your time, talent, and treasure with your church family. You will never know the profound impact you have on others - a true reflection of God's love.
