THE BIBLE IN THE PUBLIC SQUARE: LIFTING VOICES OF LAMENT, PROPHECY, AND PRAISE IN A TIME OF CHRISTIAN NATIONALISM AND RELIGIOUS EXTREMISM

Description: While many imagine that faith is a matter of private belief, Christian faith and Biblical interpretation have long been at the center of North American public square debates about race, social diversity, struggles for human liberation, and other moral discourse. In these days of ascendant Christian nationalism and religious extremism, the Bible (and its authority) are often claimed as a tool for asserting dominance and control. This seminar explores how people of faith might engage the Bible not as a weapon, but as a resource for hearing and sharing voices of lament, prophecy, and praise that speak to God's presence and purpose in the public square. We will consider how to share a Biblical faith that resists domination and strengthens our capacity for joining God's redemptive work of justice, mercy, and love in the world.

2024 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN REFLECTION

Linda and I moved from Bloomington-Normal to Springfield in 1964. Linda was Methodist and I grew up Presbyterian, and we joined Westminster Presbyterian Church 57 years ago in 1966. The Rev. Dr. Edward Ziegler was Pastor and Head of Staff and lived in the parsonage behind the church. The Rev. James Barge was the associate pastor, and the choir director was John Thompson. Our three children were baptized here and two were married in this beautiful church. I sang in the choir for over ten years under the direction of David Mitchell. I have had the privilege of serving as Deacon in the class of 1990 and as Elder in the class of 1994.

There have been many changes throughout the years. A decision was made after much thought, by vote of the congregation to stay in our present location versus moving to the west side of Springfield. This resulted in building out the church, a new Parish Hall and kitchen, remodeled classrooms, staff offices, and an elevator was installed. Westminster has had a pre-school for over 50 years. Our Memorial Garden was constructed. In 2015, the highly successful Building a Legacy of Faith Campaign was introduced to increase mission and community outreach by growing Westminster's Endowment Fund. Westminster prepares meals for Helping Hands and the Warming Center each month and supports Contact Ministries. Our church and its members support our youth fundraisers, which help fund the mission trip and purchase gifts for Contact Ministries Christmas distribution.

Through the Steadfast Neighbor program, we have met our friends and neighbors and have helped them make improvements to their homes and yards through the weeklong Steadfast Neighbor Service Week or through service grants. We have a little pantry located at Graham Elementary. Westminster purchased 626 S. Glenwood and then donated it to Habitat for Humanity for the Capler Family Steadfast Neighbor Build. The original house and garage were demolished, rebuilt by ministry partners and in-kind donation of services, and the keys presented to Paris and James Capler's family on June 29, 2023 at the dedication.

All of these things and more would not occur without financial support from our members and friends who pledge on an annual basis.
