Linda and I moved from Bloomington-Normal to Springfield in 1964. Linda attended Park Methodist Church and I attended Second Presbyterian, We joined Westminster Presbyterian Church 55 years ago in 1966. The Rev. Dr. Edward Ziegler was Pastor and Head of Staff. He and his wife lived in the parsonage behind the church facing Edwards St. The Rev. James Barge was the associate pastor, and the choir director was John Thompson. Our family consists of three adult children, who were baptized here. Two of the three were married in this beautiful church.

I sang in the choir for over ten years under the direction of David Mitchell. On May 1, 1986, Dale Rogers became the new Director of Music & the Arts. He has on occasion invited former members to sing with our outstanding choir. I have had the privilege of serving as Deacon in the class of 1990 and as Elder on Session in the class of 1994.

There have been many changes throughout the years. A decision was made after much thought, by vote of the congregation to stay in our present location verses moving to the Westside of Springfield. This helped result in building out the church, a new Parish Hall and kitchen, remodeled classrooms, staff offices, and an elevator was installed. Westminster has had a pre-school for over 50 years. A Memorial Garden was constructed. In 2015, the highly successful Building a Legacy of Faith Campaign was introduced to increase mission and community outreach by growing Westminster's Endowment Fund. The Steadfast Neighbor site and landscaping have now been completed. We have met our friends and neighbors and have become instrumental in helping them make improvements to their homes and yards through the weeklong Steadfast Neighbor Service Week. We now have a little pantry located at Graham Elementary. Westminster prepares a meal for Helping Hands each month, works with Habitat for Humanity, and supports Contact Ministries. Our youth have fundraisers to purchase items for the annual Contact Ministries Christmas distribution each year.

All of these things and more would not occur without financial support from our members and friends who pledge annually. We ask all of you, our friends, to prayerfully complete your 2022 pledge card and return it to the church this Sunday, October 24. Together we can create and continue to grow and provide financial support for the many things we do now and will be able to accomplish in the future. - Bill Schlosser
