



Westminster will continue the rich tradition of celebrating St. Andrew's Sunday on November 21 with a flourish of bagpipes and drums presenting traditional Scottish music. *The Little Entry* is the opening procession of the service. Along with the pipers, drummers and the pastors, youth will enter with the Bible to underscore the importance of the Word of God in Reformed liturgy, and the cross to highlight its centrality in our faith.

SCHOLARSHIP PRESENTATION SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 21.

During worship on Sunday, November 21, Mervice Alah Abung will be presented \$1,000 to subsidize her tuition from Westminster's Scholarship Fund. Mervice joined WPC in October 2019 by Certificate of Transfer from the Presbyterian Church of Bonaberi, Doualla, Cameroon. Mervice was born in Douaoa Cameroon, the second of eleven children. She attended a boarding school for her secondary education and continued at the University of Dschang where she graduated with a master's degree in accounting and finance. Mervice and her husband Donatus Afeseh were chosen by the United States Diversity Visa Program which permitted them to move to the USA with green cards. Mervice is currently enrolled in the University of Illinois at Springfield Master's degree program in accounting with a goal to become a CPA.
