2022 STEADFAST NEIGHBOR SERVICE WEEK – JUNE 27 – JULY 1

Last week, the team gathered Monday - Friday at 8:30 a.m. for a devotion to begin the day before arriving at our neighborhood sites. We partnered with 18 neighbors to do work on their homes. Together, we were able to: (1) Power wash



three homes and clean the gutters of four homes, installing gutter guards on one home. (2) Paint a picket fence white, four porches, two doors, intricate house trim and a window frame. (3) Install a fence, repair a fence, paint a fence. (4) Landscape six yards including removing 2 tons of rotted firewood from a neighbor's yard, (5) Completely rebuilt a porch, repair two porches, and clear one porch. (6) Provide masonry work to stabilize a porch, which was donated by Pulliam Masonry. This porch will be completed in July. (7) Clear out two garages and (8) fill two dumpsters to the rim. We will fill one more dumpster in the coming week.

Our home camp will be the First Presbyterian Church of Madisonville, KY, and we look forward to visiting the PCUSA national office and Louisville Slugger Museum in Louisville.

Many, many thanks to everyone who supported the 2022 Youth Mission through our fundraisers and the Pentecost Offering! We could not do it without you. This year the youth raised \$2,885 at the Eggtastic Breakfast, \$2,725 at the Trivia Night, \$3,356.08 from the Rising Up Suffrage Play, and \$1,270.25 during the Car Wash and Bake Sale. The youth received \$150 from the Pentecost Offering. These total \$10,386.33 thanks to the collaboration and teamwork of our youth, their parents, adult mentors, and this generous congregation.
