REFUGEE MINISTRY PRESENTATION SUNDAY, JULY 30

Rachael Hickman and Jess Weitzel, co-chairs of the Refugee Subcommittee, will present a Ministry Moment during worship on Sunday, July 30 followed by an informational meeting at 11:15 a.m. in Parish Hall. Come and learn about Westminster's vision to host a refugee family who will call Springfield their new home. Session approved the framework of this subcommittee's plan in May to work through Welcome Corps. а government program initiated this vear. (www.welcomecorps.org). Desserts and refreshments will be provided at this informational meeting as we learn more about Welcome Corps, the anticipated timeline, additional resources needed, and next steps towards hosting a refugee family.

THE LITURGICAL ARTS FESTIVAL OF SPRINGFIELD and the **GREATER SPRINGFIELD INTERFAITH ASSOCIATION** will present a program of music, dance, readings, and prayers at Westminster Presbyterian on Friday, August 4 at 7:00 p.m. This program is a satellite event leading up to the 130th anniversary gathering of the Parliament of World Religions, an organization started in Chicago in conjunction with the World's Columbian Exhibition. The Springfield program will include Native American Flute, readings and prayers in the Muslim tradition, Diane Dietz singing a solo from the Celtic Christian tradition, a Native American drum circle, Kurdish flute, the Westminster Choir singing Mendelssohn, dancers from the Table of Life Church, and a closing blessing from the Hebrew tradition. ADULT EDUCATION SUMMER FORUM SUNDAYS, AUGUST 6 & 13, 11:15 A.M. IN PARISH HALL

On Sunday, August 6, Dr. Roy Wehrle will present a forum on **BIDENOMICS:** This term describes the new economic policies that President Biden and his administration are employing. This is a sea change from the fully free market policies of the last several decades for both parties. The new policies are fashioned to account for the changed nature of the world and rise of China. The emphasis is on using the government to manage markets where necessary, such as controlling foreign trade when needed to protect our security.

On Sunday, August 13, Dr. Roy Wehrle will present a forum on **BIG DEVELOPMENTS IN CHINA:** Looking at contemporary Chinese policies will give members a view of several paths forward into the future based on current China policies and a taste of some of the ramifications for us and the rest of the world related to China's policies. The reason for suggesting such a topic now is because Xi has recently taken major domestic and foreign policy steps while faced with evolving domestic problems including lower growth, excessive debt levels, and a declining labor force.
