Our Westminster Stewardship theme, "Growing in Generosity, Rooted in Faith," is one to which we can relate. I have been a member of our church since 1969 when our family moved to Springfield. We have become "deeply rooted" here through the years. Our family has had baptisms, weddings and my husband Glen is at home in the Memorial Garden.
