STEADFAST NEIGHBOR OPPORTUNITY - Westminster continues to invest in our neighborhood through the Steadfast Neighbor Endeavor. At their November meeting, Session approved a joint recommendation from the Strategic Planning and Property Committees to *evaluate the cost of renovating 518 S. Glenwood for the purpose of selling it. Proceeds will reimburse the Support and Endowment loan approved by the congregation in 2018. At the time we purchased the home in 2018, we had not yet formulated the Site and Landscape Plan to expand our*

parking lot. Both committees concurred we no longer have a need for the property and in keeping with our commitment to the neighborhood, improvements need to be made. Immediate projects include removal and replacing the garage roof and removing carpet and padding throughout the home.
