
MAUNDY THURSDAY COMMUNION SERVICE, APRIL 6 7:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary

Easter Egg Hunt in Parish Hall follows 10:00 a.m. Worship.



FROM THE PASTOR by Rev. Dr. Blythe D. Kieffer

Following Bill Stein's Organ Recital on March 26, Peter and I hosted a dinner party for two women clergy friends, the Rev.

Drs. Julie Allen Berger and Karen Blanchard, and their husbands who traveled to Springfield to hear Bill and to meet Dale.





2021, when I co-officiated with Dr. Berger for the wedding of Dr. Blanchard's daughter at First Presbyterian Church of Kirkwood. Bill Stein was the organist, and when I mentioned I worked with Dale Rogers at Westminster in Springfield, Bill spoke highly of Dale as a musician and as one of his mentors.

The recital was inspiring with Bill's selection of contemporary women composers in honor of Women's History Month in preparation for Holy Week. Listening to the music in the company of two dear friends and fellow women clergy with whom I have journeyed through the vicissitudes of ministry was especially meaningful. Julie, Karen, and I began a friendship when I moved to the St. Louis metropolitan area in 1982 to begin ministry. We met for lunch in the Central West End with women clergy hosted by the Rev. Evlyn Wehling Fulton, Executive Presbyter for the Presbytery of Giddings-Lovejoy, who made a special effort to take young clergywomen under her wings. When the three of us were asked to give eulogies at her memorial service, I reflected on Deuteronomy 32:11: As an eagle stirs up its nest, and hovers over its young, as it spreads its wings, takes them up, and bears them aloft on its pinions, so does the Lord guide Israel.

In my mind's eye, this picture of leadership: an eagle nurturing and teaching its young to fly described the life and ministry of Evlyn who had the strength and vision of an eagle, stirring up the nest, hovering (in the best sense of the word), bearing up those she loved, empowering them to fly, and when one faltered, being there to catch, to encourage and to guide the next flight.

I am grateful for the gift of Evlyn, whose nurture made a difference in my life and ministry, and for those "Evlyns" in each of our lives who take us under their wings with affection and joy, reflecting the loving God whom we honor this Holy Week.

SUNDAYS, APRIL 16 AND 23, 11:15 A.M. IN PARISH HALL


The Adult Ed Forum presents SOLUTIONS TO CLIMATE CHANGE: AN INTERACTIVE PRESENTATION on Sundays, April 16 and 23. At the first session participants will engage in an interactive presentation led by Andy Panelli who will show how each suggested action will impact climate change on a MIT/Sloan simulator that will model their proposed solution instantly in

real-time. The second session will be a follow up led by Dr. Werhle.

Andrew Panelli is a graduate of the University of Notre Dame (BA, MBA) and has spent 3 decades with Fortune 500 companies in product development and marketing, with an emphasis on how to produce products that generate less waste, higher performance, and reduced landfill impact. Panelli is a group

leader for Citizens' Climate Education, which is a non-profit and non-partisan grassroots organization dedicated to educating the public on smart climate solutions. Andy is a longtime friend of the Kieffers, and we are excited to welcome him back to Westminster.

Dr. Roy Werhle earned a Ph.D. in economics in 1959 from Yale University, served the U.S. State Department and on President Kennedy's Council of Economic Advisors before he worked for the Agency for International Development in Laos. In 1964 he was sent to Vietnam and served as an economic advisor to three U.S. ambassadors until 1967, while also serving as the Assistant Director of the aid mission. He is Emeritus Professor at the University of Illinois at Springfield where he taught globalization & international governance for 49 years.

Sixth and Seventh Graders will not meet during the month of April because of special worship experiences and will resume class on Sunday, May 7.



On Tuesday, March 21 the Steadfast Neighbor Habitat Build Kickoff was held in Parish Hall. Dr. Todd Knox welcomed 80 members and friends of the community. The service began with Dale Rogers playing "It's a Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood" and closed with the hymn "Let Us Build a House." Paris and James Capler expressed appreciation to Habitat, Westminster, and all the generous partners and sponsors who are making their home a reality.

The decking was completed on March 24 and 25 and the Blitz Build Week began Monday, March 27 under sunny skies. Dr. Kieffer signed the Bible presented to the Caplers by their Family Nurturer, Cheryl McKnelly. The Monday afternoon crew is pictured below standing in front of the newly raised walls. Following the Blitz Week, professionals will install roofing, siding, soffit, facia, and mechanical during the first two weeks of April. Following the City Inspection on April 19, insulation will be installed by professionals. The next scheduled work opportunity for ministry partners are April 21-22, 28-29, and May 5-6 to hang drywall on-site and paint exterior doors and baseboards at Habitat.
