



### ADULT EDUCATION SUMMER FORUM SUNDAYS, AUGUST 6 & 13, 11:15 A.M. IN PARISH HALL

On Sunday, August 6, Dr. Roy Wehrle will present a forum on **BIDENOMICS**: This term describes the new economic policies that President Biden and his administration are employing. This is a sea change from the fully free market policies of the last several decades for both parties. The new policies are fashioned to account for the changed nature of the world and rise of China. The emphasis is on using government to manage markets where necessary such as controlling foreign trade when needed to protect our security. Roy's short briefing on Bidenomics will explain why this change from the former Reagonomics has been chosen, how it is supposed to work, and the intended results.

On Sunday, August 13, Dr. Roy Wehrle will present a forum on **BIG DEVELOPMENTS IN CHINA:** Looking at contemporary Chinese policies will give members a view of several paths forward into the future based on current China policies and a taste of some of the ramifications for us and the rest of the world related to China's policies. The reason for suggesting such a topic now is because Xi has recently taken major domestic and foreign policy steps while faced with evolving domestic problems including lower growth, excessive debt levels, and a declining labor force.


