FROM THE PASTOR by Rev. Dr. Blythe D. Kieffer

Dear Friends,

The staff joins me in wishing you a joyous Advent and a meaningful Christmas. As we begin the Christian calendar anew, we enter this Holy Season with hope, expectation, and a new appreciation for "a time to wait." The good news of effective vaccines and the anticipation of returning to life as we knew it before the pandemic gives us a reason to rejoice. Although we will miss the festive gatherings in December and in-person worship for the Centennial Candlelight Service, we have hope.

Spera in Deo! Hope in God! These are the words with which we begin our advent journey each year. The Latin root for spera means to hope or to wait! Linguistically linked, waiting is an integral part of our hoping and without hope it is difficult to wait.

There is a purpose in our waiting. To wait is not a bad consequence. It is not an absence or delay of experience but a deliberate action. Waiting involves the passage of time during which there can be healing, growth, introspection, and resolution. Waiting is also an integral part of human growth and development. It is at the heart of our growing up and our becoming God's children.

As the Kieffer Household begins Advent on the heels of Peter's heart surgery last month, this understanding of the relationship between "to hope" and "to wait" is especially meaningful. As Peter's heart continues to heal in this time of waiting and hoping, both of our hearts are




Community members who walked through our doors to vote were invited into our sanctuary for prayer or quiet solitude during this uncertain and anxious time.
