HANGING OF THE GREENS MUSICAL PRESENTATION - The morning includes a special musical presentation of the "Hanging of the Greens" by Westminster Choristers (Grades 3-5) and the Children's Choir (Grades K-2) during the 10:00 a.m. worship service.




