

WESTMINSTER WELCOMES REV. JIMMIE HAWKINS MLK SUNDAY, JANUARY 15



On MLK Sunday, January 15, the Rev. Jimmie Hawkins will preach and present а workshop following worship in Parish Hall. Rev. Hawkins serves as the Director of Church the Presbyterian (USA) Office of Public Witness in Washington, DC.

He earned a Bachelor of Arts in Social Studies from North Carolina Central University (Durham, NC); a Master of Arts in Christian Education from the Presbyterian School of Christian Education (Richmond, VA); and a Master of Divinity from the Interdenominational Theological Center/Johnson C. Smith Theological Seminary (Atlanta, GA).

For twenty years Rev. Hawkins served as the pastor of Covenant Presbyterian Church in Durham, NC, 1996-2016. Between 1992-1996, he served as the senior pastor of Grace Presbyterian, Holmes Memorial and Trinity Presbyterian Churches in Virginia (Peaks Presbytery).

Rev. Hawkins served as Treasurer on the Church World Service global board and as a board member of the National Council of Churches. He was a board trustee with Union Presbyterian Seminary. He is a tri-chair of the Washington Interreligious Staff Community and the Heads of Washington Offices. He has chaired several interfaith/ecumenical and non-profit boards.

His book, <u>Unbroken and Unbowed: A History of Black Protest</u> <u>in America</u>, published by Westminster John Knox Press, came out in February 2022.

We are grateful for his good work on behalf of the Presbyterian Church (USA) and anticipate our time together with great joy as we honor the ministry and life of the Rev. Dr. King.


