FROM THE PASTOR by Rev. Dr. Blythe D. Kieffer

His mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years... Luke 2:51b-52a

Christmas Eve at Westminster was a holy and joyous occasion as we delighted in our children acting out the story of Jesus' birth at the 5:00 p.m. service, enjoyed a delicious meal hosted



by the Board of Deacons, and were bathed in the light of candles, lessons and carols at the 7:30 p.m. service. Each service had its own character and we welcomed a total of 300 in both services. There were over 80 views from households of families gathered together

for the 7:30 p.m. livestreamed Lessons and Carols Service.

The First Sunday after Christmas Day our lectionary reading was Luke, Chapter 2, where we discover twelve-year old Jesus sitting in the temple with the teachers, listening and asking questions. Luke is the only gospel writer that gives us a glimpse into the faith development of Jesus' young life and for this we are grateful. We learn from Luke that Jesus' childhood revolved around his home and faith community. Jesus did not come into his own without the relationships that shaped his faith growing up.

What is true for Jesus is also true for us. Children growing up



in Westminster celebrate milestones on their faith journey. The rituals around baptism, the third grade Bible presentation, and confirmation mark transitions as our children increase in wisdom and in years.

On Sunday, December 26, we welcomed Madison Jean, daughter of Morgan and Scott Durco, in the Sacrament of Baptism.

As we move into the new year and reflect on Jesus' birth and childhood, may

January 12 at 4:45 p.m. The project for the coming months is the preparation of music for the Ash




Wednesday service and the musical on Sunday, May 1, 2022.

Thank you for your faithfulness and financial support for the work and mission of Westminster. We ended November with expenses exceeding income by \$34,833. Our 2021 budget included a \$15,000 deficit. However, with strong income from year-end donations, we could overcome the projected deficit.
