### FROM THE PASTOR by Rev. Dr. Blythe D. Kieffer

On a Tuesday evening in late November, Christy and Karl Pound hosted a Legacy of Faith Endowment Planned Giving Reception at their home. About 30 members (who have

included Westminster in their will or are considering this possibility) gathered to enjoy fellowship, hear brief presentations by Randy Germeraad, Dr. Diane Rutledge, & Jeff Wilday, partake in a



lovely buffet prepared by Pat Hymans, and listen to a musical presentation by Jay Kennerly and Dale Rogers. I had asked Dale and Jay to present Moon River for this occasion. Moon River is a love song of sorts; however, it is foremost a song about an unexpected friendship and trust: two friends off to see the world and crossing a mile-wide river in style. The lyrics are a reference to Huckleberry Finn and his adventures on the Mississippi River with Jim, an enslaved black man. The raft is a place where Huck and Jim find refuge in each other away from the restraints and expectations of society.

The raft can also be a metaphor for the refuge we find on our spiritual journeys and in this faith community (which was born out of our founders' conviction that all are beloved children of God, created free, and worthy of respect) and the unexpected friendships we discover when we have the courage to move beyond the prejudices and restraints of society today. How grateful we are for the mile-wide river we traverse together at Westminster and for the unexpected, intergenerational friendships we celebrate on this raft where we find safety, share honesty, and grow spiritually. On Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord and gather within the ark of our sanctuary to renew our baptismal covenant and to ordain newly elected church officers. We do so with gratitude and joy!

#### November Financial Report by Lisa Runkle

We have received strong support throughout 2023 for the ministry of Westminster! With year-end giving, we expect to finish the year with a positive net balance. At the end of November, income and expenses are each above budgeted amounts. Our net total is \$2,619 income exceeding expenses.

#### **2024 STEADFAST NEIGHBOR INITIATIVE**

Westminster continues to invest in our neighborhood through the Steadfast Neighbor Endeavor. In addition to the Matching Grant Program and Service Week (June 17-21) in 2024, the 518 S. Glenwood Home is being renovated for the purpose of placing it on the market.





Proceeds from the sale will reimburse the Support and Endowment loan approved by the congregation in 2018. At the time we purchased the home in 2018, we had not yet formulated the Site and Landscape Plan to expand our parking lot. We no longer have a need for the property and in keeping with our commitment to the neighborhood, improvements need to be made.



During December, a team including Brownie Anderson, Ellen Carpenter, Bud Green, Tim Kluge, Jim McDonough, Tom Owen, Mike Sundquist, and Pete VanGieson worked together to remove the carpet and padding throughout the home and to remove and replace the garage roof.
