

FROM THE PASTOR by Rev. Dr. Blythe D. Kieffer

On Sunday, July 9, Peter, Paul, and I will be in Stowe, VT for the 40th Anniversary Dedication Celebration of an interfaith chapel on Mt. Mansfield. Peter's father, William Kieffer, Jr., was instrumental in creating The Stowe Mountain Chapel. You may have seen the photo of this lovely chapel in my study.



In 1977, following the tragic death of Will's nine-year-old daughter, Mary Donnelly "Polly" Kieffer, who loved to climb and ski the mountain, the Kieffer family held a memorial service near where the Chapel now stands. This was the beginning of a collaboration between Will and the Rev. Marcus Hall, the Rector of St. John's Episcopal Church.

The following explanation for creating the chapel is included in their brochure: "Throughout recorded history, mountains have been places where people have felt closer to God: Mountaintop experiences are recorded by those who received renewal and insight that became courage for all humanity. Amidst the challenges of ordinary life, a mountaintop journey provides a new perspective within the wonder, beauty, and mystery of God's creation. On the highest mountain in Vermont there is now a place where one may experience that closeness to God. So that everyone may feel at home in this chapel, symbols of any religion have been purposely omitted. The circular simplicity of this building in its natural setting speaks to the unity of God's creation and spirit."

I began visiting the chapel and leading worship services on the annual "Polly Walk" when I married Peter. The summer of 1992, I brought the youth mission team from the First United Presbyterian Church in Belleville to the chapel.

Westminster partnered with seven neighbors to do work on their homes. Five crews (led by able captains Rev. Christian Choi, Tim Kluge, Julie Robbs, Pete VanGieson, and Gary Warnick) worked diligently and were all well-nourished with fabulous lunches served by Pat Hyman's Hospitality Team. Projects included power washing, painting and repairing porches, reconstructing a walkway, and replacing a cellar door. Additionally, our flower team created 30 flowerpots for participating neighbors since we began our Steadfast Neighbor Mission Outreach in 2020. We had fewer projects this year because of the Steadfast Neighbor Habitat Build. We continue to provide matching grants and stock our Little Pantry at Graham School daily. The plan is to invest \$450,000 in the neighborhood during this decade.


