#### Dear Friends,

The 223rd General Assembly will be held in St. Louis, Missouri June 16 – 23. The theme is "Renewing the Vision: Kingdom Building for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century," based on Matthew 6:25-33. The General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) meets biennially in even-numbered years. It consists of commissioners elected by each of its 173 presbyteries. The assembly acts on hundreds of items of business, which it receives through the reports and recommendations of various assembly entities, and through overtures from synods and presbyteries. I will attend the assembly again this year and bring news from the gathering. I am grateful to Marty Sumner who will host me in her new home during my stay in St. Louis.

Members of the APNC also plan to participate in "face-to-face" interviews overseen by Church Leadership Connection. Please continue to pray for the APNC, chaired by Susan Day, as they discern WPC's next call. Neither candidate we brought to Springfield in May worked out. We trust the process, God's timing, and are grateful to the Reverend Trajan McGill, who will lead the 2018 Youth Mission Trip as he did in 2017.

# FOUNDERS' SUNDAY CELEBRATED "HAIL ABIAH HALE"

On Founders' Sunday, we celebrated "Hail Abiah Hale!" as we marked our third year since the dedication of the Building a Legacy of Faith Anniversary Endowment Campaign. Dale Smith provided the ministry moment on behalf of the Endowment Committee and Carole Kennerly played Jane Wright who talked enthusiastically about her dear friend, Abiah.

Currently, 240 families are members of the Albert Hale Circle and have either made gifts, pledges or included Westminster in their planned giving. We have received \$1,342,971 toward pledges of \$1,623,450 and gifts of \$118,890. We need \$1.15 million to reach our goal of increasing Westminster's Endowment from \$1.9 to \$5 million by 2020! #### EARTH CARE TEAM NEWS

**EARTH CARE TIP** – Are the dog days of summer starting to brown your green grass? If you cannot easily push a screwdriver several inches into the soil, then your lawn is thirsty. Save time, conserve precious water, and improve



lawn health by running the sprinkler for about an hour once a week at dawn. More frequent watering encourages weeds and disease while much of afternoon sprinkling ends up evaporating.
