

A CELEBRATION OF THE REVEREND TRAJAN I. McGILL SUNDAY, JUNE 13, RECEPTION FOLLOWING 10:00 A.M. WORSHIP

Sunday, June 13 will be the last Sunday the Reverend Trajan I. McGill leads worship at Westminster as our Associate Pastor for Parish Life. A Service of Parting will be included in the worship services and a reception celebrating Trajan's ministry will be held in Parish Hall following worship.

Trajan began his journey with Westminster on Sunday, February 1, 2015, and was ordained in our Sanctuary on Sunday, March 22. We are grateful for Rev. McGill's leadership working closely with the Board of Deacons and the Mission and Community Service Committee. Trajan has been instrumental in shaping the vision of mission at Westminster in response to our endowment growth. His expertise in I.T. has been invaluable during the pandemic as we initiated online and live stream worship. During the pastoral interim, Trajan led two ASP Youth Mission trips. Within the community, he served on the Board of the Coalition for the Common Good volunteered with the Rochester Fire Department.





Rev. McGill is a graduate of Harvard College (2001) and Princeton Theological Seminary (2007). Prior to joining our staff, Trajan served as a Senior Business Systems Analyst and Information Technology Consultant during his wife, Sarah's, tenure as Associate Pastor for Fair Oaks Presbyterian Church in Oak Park, Illinois (2010-2015). Trajan has accepted a position related to his previous experience in the technology field.

The Reverend Ryan Landino, Lead Presbyter for Transformation of the Presbytery of Great Rivers, will participate in worship on June 13.

FROM THE PASTOR by Rev. Dr. Blythe D. Kieffer

Thirty-five years ago on May 1, 1986, Dale Rogers began his tenure with Westminster continuing the rich tradition of exceptional music. We cannot imagine worship without Dale's music ministry increasing and nourishing our spirits.

We are grateful to those who served on the search committee. A few of these members joined us May 2. Keith Beatty, Jeanne Pittman, Mary Anne Singleton. Also serving on that committee were Dr. Roland Cull, Joe Eby, Randy Germeraad, Alice Payne, Madeline Thompson, and chair, Dr. Richard Moy.

The gift we selected to honor this milestone anniversary has many layers of meaning. It is a sculpture by Wildwood entitled The Tai Chi Man. Tai Chi means "supreme ultimate" which describes what Dale works toward in all the music he creates. Tai Chi is a form of exercise sometimes described as meditation in motion because it promotes serenity through gentle movements — connecting the mind and body...not unlike the effect music has on those who worship. Discipline, breath control, and strength are



essential in both Tai Chi and vocal performance. In the same way that the whole is greater than the individual parts in Tai Chi, harmony is the sum of all the voices in music. The pose of the man reminds us of Dale's essential role as our director and conductor.

We would be remiss if we did not draw attention to the feet in this sculpture since one of the silver linings of the pandemic has been introducing the world through online worship to the feet of Dale Rogers as we marvel at his skillful organ playing.

It is difficult to miss the resemblance to the cross and Christ figure in this sculpture. The depth of Dale's faith shines through the breadth of his musical and scriptural knowledge and how the music he selects complements the theological message. On behalf of Rev. McGill and Rev. Choi, it is a joy to collaborate in worship planning with Dale Rogers.

Finally, this sculpture reminds us of an Oscar. The quality of music under Dale's leadership is Oscar worthy. On his 35th Anniversary, we thank Dale from the bottom of our hearts. Truly, our Mr. Rogers, is the heart and soul of this congregation.

preparing the Memorial Garden and grounds for Founders' Sunday.





In May of 2015, on the 180th Founders' Sunday, Westminster dedicated the BUILDING A LEGACY OF FAITH TWENTY-YEAR Anniversary Endowment Campaign and established the ALBERT HALE CIRCLE with a goal to grow Westminster's Endowment from \$1.7 to \$5 million by 2020. Currently, \$1,598,975 from the 101 pledges totaling \$1,646,620 has been received. Additionally, non-pledge gifts and gifts exceeding pledges of \$2,830,674 were donated. The market value of the Support and Endowment Fund was \$8,308,882 on March 31, 2021. This does not include planned gifts.

Bundles of Joy is a project of the Ann T. Havey Foundation, which was established in honor of Dr. Meredith Volle's grandmother. \$1,000 from the Endowment Mission Grants budget will supply newborn and premature infant



clothing and supplies to local families of newborns in need.

As a pediatrician caring for newborns, Meredith found that clothing is a need often unfulfilled for underserved families with few resources. To meet this need "Bundles of Joy" are provided to families of newborn children in Springfield.

Each bundle consists of approximately 10 items of newborn (or premie) clothing, a blanket, books and a diaper bag. It costs about \$25 per bundle, and they have given out more than 550 so far! They serve the families of newborns in Springfield by providing bundles to both local hospitals, the NICU, SIU Pediatrics, Central Counties Health Centers, The Parent Place, and Mini O'Beirne Crisis Nursery.


