## FROM THE PASTOR by Rev. Dr. Blythe D. Kieffer

This Founders' Sunday we will dedicate the final detail of the Steadfast Neighbor Site and Landscape Plan: a newly installed



history plaque located outside the northeast corner of the Sanctuary. The bronze plaque is mounted on architectural stone from our 1871 church building which has been stored on the Blythe Farm for many years.

Dale Rogers designed the plaque and Peter Kieffer collaborated in the concise

distillation of Westminster's 186-year history into less than 75 words:

Thirty ardent abolitionists, some of whom conducted the Underground Railroad, founded this congregation in 1835 at our first church known as Second Presbyterian. Our 1840 tower bell, which tolled for the Emancipation Proclamation in our second church, still calls worshippers today. This plaque rests on stone remaining from our third church. We now worship in this fourth church, designed in a rural English Gothic style by Cram & Ferguson, dedicated in 1908, and later named Westminster.

#### MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND HIGHLIGHTS: MEMORIAL GARDEN



Our Memorial Garden is a place of peace and repose for the ashes of those interred within its walls. A traditional Celtic cross, donated by Mary Alice Davis in memory of her husband, depicts the post resurrection appearances of Christ when he appeared in the garden.

Each Memorial Sunday, Westminster's Memorial Garden is highlighted. Recent additions include a south wall in 2018, a brick trim to complement the southside landscape designed by the late Bill Donels. We are grateful to the

Memorial Team of the Landscape Guild, led by Dr. Scott Day, who lovingly tend to the garden.

The cost of an individual inurnment in the South wall is \$1,000 for a member or their immediate family and \$2,000 for friends of Westminster. Persons desiring to reserve space may complete an application form located in the West Narthex and on our website. In 2016, a page was added to the Church website with biographical information about those inurned in the garden.




## VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL JUNE 13-17

## WESTMINSTER COOPERATIVE PRESCHOOL CELEBRATES 50<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY SUNDAY, MAY 22, 2022



At the September 8, 1971 Session meeting, it was reported that the cooperative nursery school would begin Monday, September 13, 1971 with 29 students enrolled. The tuition for 3 y/o's was \$15 and 4 y/o's \$20 per month. The philosophy of parent involvement in a cooperative endeavor to learning was at the heart of the initiative by the steering committee. Although not religious in nature, being based in a church was important to the vision. The first three presidents of the board were Sue Bingaham, Sue Cull, and Carole Kennerly. Dick Cordier designed and organized the parents to build the first outside playground equipment. The sand and water box continues to be a beloved tradition for our students today.

Teachers serving over these fifty years are Joan Linnartz, Clara Copeland, Janice Cook, Cindy Clark, Jane Suter, Gina Solomon, Beth Waldman, Noel Scott, Kari Soria, Emily Rowley, Amy Bonansinga, and Kacey Belitsos. The NAEYC (National Association for the Education of Young Children) accreditation began during Beth Waldman's tenure and reflects the excellence of our preschool which is respected throughout the Springfield community. We are grateful for the children within our congregation and community whose start in life has been and continues to be enriched by Westminster Cooperative Preschool.

#### MARCH FINANCIAL REPORT by Lisa Runkle

Donations received during the first quarter of 2022 were \$16,100 more than those received in 2021 for the same period. In addition, total Operating Fund income is over \$60,000 more than budgeted through the end of March because of those donations and increased mission giving. Expenses are over budget by \$16,026 since an equal amount of mission expenses offset the increased mission giving. Therefore, we currently have income exceeding expenses by \$44,127.
