Our Memorial Garden is a place of peace and repose for the ashes of those interred within its walls. A traditional Celtic cross, donated by Mary Alice Davis in memory of her husband, depicts the post-resurrection appearances of Christ when he appeared in the garden.

Each Memorial Sunday, Westminster's Memorial Garden is highlighted. Recent additions include a south wall in 2018, a brick trim to complement the southside landscape designed by the late Bill Donels. We are grateful to the







#### May Earth Care Tip

Springtime resurrects our sunny green lawns, but grass often struggles to revive itself in the shade. For shady areas, consider substituting evergreen ground cover like ivy, euonymus, or pachysandra which crowd out most



weeds, need occasional pruning, and require rare watering but no fertilizers. Over one to two years, pachysandra has covered the long shady bed just north of our sanctuary with a blanket of green. Although not considered invasive in Illinois, limit these robust ground covers to bordered gardens and prevent vines from climbing trees.
