ST. ANDREW'S SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 21 ONE SERVICE OF WORSHIP AT 10:00 A.M. WITH PIPES AND DRUMS



Westminster will continue the rich tradition of celebrating St. Andrew's Sunday on November 21 with a flourish of bagpipes and drums presenting traditional Scottish music. *The Little Entry* is the opening procession of the service. Along with the pipers, drummers and the pastors, youth will enter with the Bible to underscore the importance of the Word of God in Reformed liturgy, and the cross to highlight its centrality in our faith.

The day commemorates the feast of St. Andrew, who was the elder brother of the

apostle, Peter. Relics of St. Andrew were brought to Kilrymont in Scotland (renamed St. Andrews, the location of the famous golf course) and for this reason Andrew is the patron saint of Scotland. The Presbyterian Church was established as the Church of Scotland in 1560 by an act of the Scottish Parliament. The newly reformed Scottish



Church emphasized universal education, government support of the poor, and a church that is free from interference by the crown.

In Westminster's observance, elements that remain constant are bagpipes, the flag of Scotland, singing from the Scottish Psalter, and the clergy tartan paraments presented to Westminster in 1985 in loving memory of Scott Hoff.

Westminster's Choir will sing A Scottish Blessing by David Blackwell. This year we welcome our Financial Administrator, Lisa Runkle, and Augusta Leigh Harris-Patel who will dance the Village Maid/Highland Laddie.

NOVEMBER EARTH CARE TIP



The 23rd Psalm reminds us that our cup overflows, but from which earth-friendly cup should we drink? Although Styrofoam cups insulate well with low production and

transportation costs, we cannot reuse or recycle them so their tiny bits end up all over creation. Ceramic mugs and glasses have the lowest environmental impact if reused hundreds of times, cleansed in the dishwasher, and left to air dry. Dedicated sippers can sup from reusable and recyclable stainless steel thermally-insulated coffee mugs (e.g., Contigo) which keep hot drinks hot, cold drinks cold, and soda fizzy all day long. *-Dr. Peter Kieffer*
