
ADULT EDUCATION FORUM FALL SCHEDULE


PASTOR LED BIBLE STUDIES CONTINUE IN 2017-2018

CONFIRMATION AND JUNIOR HIGH INFO MEETING COMMOTION SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 10 AT 9:30 A.M.

Join Natalie Knox for an informational meeting on Commotion Sunday (September 10th) at 9:30 a.m. in the Sanctuary to review the exciting curriculum as our youth learn about the Bible and the Presbyterian Church in preparation for membership.

CONFIRMATION AND JUNIOR HIGH YOUTH GROUP 4:00 – 5:30 P.M. (SECOND FLOOR)

Confirmation is the process through which our young people affirm the vows made at their Baptism and become active members of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). At WPC, this journey is woven into fellowship time to build relationships.


