WESTMINSTER SUPPORT AND ENDOWMENT FUNDS STEADFAST NEIGHBOR ENDEAVOR

Earnings from the principle of Westminster's Support and Endowment Fund provide the loan payments and resources for the mission component. A minimum of 1/3 of the cost of the Site and Landscape Plan is designated for mission.

In May of 2015, on the 180th Founders' Sunday, Westminster dedicated the BUILDING A LEGACY OF FAITH TWENTY-YEAR Anniversary Endowment Campaign and established the ALBERT HALE CIRCLE with a goal to grow Westminster's Endowment from \$1.7 to \$5 million by 2020. As of June 2020, \$1,589,490 from the 100 pledges totaling \$1,648,120 has been received. Additionally, non-pledge gifts of \$2,762,287 were donated. The current market value of the Support and Endowment Fund is \$7,297,336. This does not include planned gifts.




MUSIC NOTES by Dale T. Rogers

"O be joyful in the Lord, all ye lands: serve the Lord with gladness, and come before God's presence with a song." These

words from Psalm 100 set to music by C.V. Stanford have been the first words sung by the choir each fall as the Westminster Choir returned to singing their weekly services. Sadly, with the looming presence of the COVID-19 virus, this is not a season for choral and congregational song.

We are very much as the Israelites were when they were captives of the Babylonians when they lamented "how can we sing the Lord's song in this strange land?"



While our understanding of the virus has grown throughout these past months, scientists, medical professionals, and the CDC continue to maintain that "the act of singing may contribute to transmission of COVID-19." The American Choral Directors Association underscores that even masks do not sufficiently contain the aerosol spread related to singing. Therefore, at Westminster, as we gather in a worshiping community, we practice caution by our masked silence during the hymns and spoken responses.

During this time in this "strange land," we must use our private silence as a time to meditate on and to absorb the meaning and the depth of the beautifully crafted texts of our hymns, prayers, and responses.

St. Paul, while he encouraged the Ephesians and the Colossians to sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, he also encouraged the Philippians to "look not at your own interests, but to the interests of others." So, our reluctant silence is a responsible way of looking out for the health of our community and a way to make our worship a safe place for both our bodies and our spirits.

During this time, we continue to be blessed by Lyle VanDeventer, bass, who serves as the hymn singer for our congregation. Over the summer, our spirits have been lifted up with the musical gifts of Abby Attig, Brian Blythe, Julie Blythe, Ann Collins, Diane Dietz, Jay Kennerly, Carolyn Lowe, Adam Miller, Kamen Petkov, Krista Steller, David Tell, and Eleanor VanDeventer. For the celebration of the Steadfast Neighbor Project on Sunday, September 27, we will welcome members of the Millikin Brass who will provide a festive note to that service and long-awaited occasion.

Together, we were able to: (1) Power wash nine homes. (2) Paint a picket fence white, the Verizon garage, the transformer, the back addition to our rental home, and miscellaneous doors and porch railings throughout the neighborhood. (3) Remove a concrete sidewalk, design and install a brick sidewalk in its stead. (4) Install fence panels enclosing a backyard. (5) Remove steps to a front porch, design and install new steps and railings in its stead. (6) Repair the brick foundation of a porch. (7) Remove shrubbery and trim trees and bushes for five homes...and haul our shrubbery and additional piles of shrubbery in the neighborhood to the recycle center. Westminster invested \$8,490.67 in our neighborhood!

The West Terrace and East Entry were designed by Architect John Shafer and erected by Mark Sexton's Landscape Concepts. Mark also created and installed the landscape design. Lighting has been purchased from Springfield Electric Co. and is being installed by B&B Electrical Contractor. Cost of the Site and Landscape Plan is approximately \$1.38 million.

A Note from your Parish Nurse


