JULY FINANCIAL REPORT by Lisa Runkle

Thank you for the increased donations received in response to the contribution statement mailing. At the end of July, income exceeds expenses by \$30,621 year-to-date. Revenue from pledges and Ukraine relief donations brought income more than \$36,000 above budgeted revenue, and expenses including the funds sent for Ukraine relief are more than \$5,800 over budget.


